

## I AM DECLARATIONS - WITH SCRIPTURE

**Instructions** - We encourage you to read these declarations of who you are in Christ aloud. You can read all of it in one sitting or take your time and work through things paragraph by paragraph or even page by page. Jared specifically has found great breakthrough by reading through these every day for a month. That consistency helped him partner with God in renewing his mind.

I am a child of God (John 1:12). I have been justified through faith in Christ (Romans 5:1). I have been pardoned and acquitted (Isaiah 55:7). I have been forgiven (1 John 1:9). I am clothed with the righteousness of Jesus (2 Corinthians 5:21). A mantle of holiness has been placed on me (Isaiah 61:10). My history has been rewritten (2 Corinthians 5:17). I belong to my Father (1 John 3:1). I am deeply loved by God (Ephesians 3:17-19). I renounce and reject the lie that I must compete for God's love (Ephesians 2:8-9) or that God's love has limits (Psalm 103:8). God's love for me is unchanging, unconditional, and unending (James 1:17; Romans 5:8; Jeremiah 31:3). My performance cannot change it. The demonic hosts cannot stop it. The future will not alter it. No one can separate me from it (Romans 8:38-39). I am deeply loved by my Father in Heaven (1 John 4:10).

I renounce the lie that I am guilty (Romans 8:1), unprotected (Psalm 91:4), alone (Deuteronomy 31:8; Hebrews 13:5), or abandoned (Isaiah 49:15-16). I am secure in Christ (John 10:28-29). I belong to God (Isaiah 43:1). I am a possessor of grace and mercy (Ephesians 2:8-9). I am made complete in Christ (Colossians 2:10). I am chosen by God (1 Peter 2:9). I am wanted (John 15:16). I am adopted into His family (Ephesians 1:5; Romans 8:15). I am an heir of God and a coheir with Christ (Romans 8:17). I have been rescued from the dominion of darkness to be established in the love and kingdom of God (Colossians 1:13-14). I am a prince/princess in the kingdom of God (Romans 8:17; Revelation 1:5-6). I am set apart to rule and reign through His love and His power (Revelation 5:10).

Everything Jesus bought and paid for is my inheritance (Ephesians 1:11). I am richly adorned and provided for (Philippians 4:19). I may boldly come to my Father in heaven and ask for anything in Jesus' name (John 14:13-14). I am anointed and set apart to rule and accomplish even greater things than Jesus has (2 Corinthians 1:21-22; John 14:12). I have been marked with a seal (Ephesians 1:13). The Holy Spirit lives in me and has given me gifts to glorify my Father in Heaven (1 Corinthians 3:16; 1 Corinthians 12:4-6). The Holy Spirit has given me the fruit of love, joy, peace, patience, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, kindness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23).

I am in Christ, and Christ is in me (Galatians 3:26-28; Colossians 1:27). I am blameless and free from all accusation and all condemnation (Colossians 1:22; Romans 8:1). A robe of righteousness has been placed on me (Isaiah 61:10). All forms of shame have been removed and any area where I've been exposed is covered (Isaiah 54:4). I have been washed white as snow because of the blood of Jesus (Isaiah 1:18). He did it all for me because He loves me and because of who He is (Romans 5:8). I didn't have to do anything for it (Ephesians 2:8-9). I have been made clean by the word of God alive in me (John 15:3; Hebrews 4:12; Colossians 3:16). No accusation can withstand the truth of what Christ has done for me (Romans 8:33-34).

I am deeply loved by my Father (Ephesians 3:17-19). I have been adopted into His family (Romans 8:15). God delights in me and I delight in Him (Zephaniah 3:17). I am on the road to glory (2 Corinthians 3:18). I am God's friend (John 15:15). I am at peace with God (Romans 5:1). God is for me. And if God is for me, who can be against me? (Romans 8:31). I have been bought at the price of Jesus' blood (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). I am valuable (Matthew 10:31). I am not my own (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). I have been set free (John 8:36). I have been redeemed (Galatians 3:13). I have been given eternal life and that abundant life starts now (John 10:10). I am a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). I am more than a conqueror (Romans 8:37). I no longer fight for victory; I start from victory (1 Corinthians 15:57; 2 Corinthians 2:14). I am an overcomer (1 John 5:4, Revelation 12:11). I have been called into the family of God (Ephesians 2:19). Christ is my Head and I choose to follow Him (Ephesians 4:15-16; Matthew 16:24). I choose to be changed by Him and I choose to partner with Him in all that He is doing (Matthew 4:19; 1 Corinthians 3:9).

I am a significant member of Christ's body with divine purpose and calling (1 Corinthians 12:27; 2 Timothy 1:9). I have been called to carry His presence (1 Corinthians 3:16). I am an ambassador for Christ (2 Corinthians 5:20). I am a witness (Acts 1:8). I am a royal priesthood, a holy nation (1 Peter 2:9). I am a vessel containing the glory of God to be used however He sees fit (2 Timothy 2:21). I am not the tail. I am always at the top, never at the bottom (Deuteronomy 28:13). This world is not my home, Christ is (Philippians 3:20). I am a conduit of God's blessings and love to a world in need of Him (Matthew 5:16).

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I am included in Christ (Ephesians 1:13). I am righteous because of Christ (2 Corinthians 5:21). I have nothing to prove (Galatians 2:20). I have nothing to fear for God is with me (Isaiah 41:10). His rod and staff comfort me and guide me (Psalm 23:4). What's more, I have not been given a spirit of fear but of power, love, and a sound mind, so I choose not to fear anyone (2 Timothy 1:7; Psalm 27:1). I will choose courage and faith instead (Joshua 1:9). I have a peace that surpasses all understanding which guards my heart and my mind in Christ (Philippians 4:7). I have been given the mind of Christ (1 Corinthians 2:16).

I renounce the lie that I am rejected, unloved, or shameful (Ephesians 1:4-5; Romans 8:38-39; Romans 10:11). I am God's workmanship, His handiwork, and His masterpiece (Ephesians 2:10). I don't have to be in control (Proverbs 3:5-6). I can trust every word and promise from God; therefore, I can also trust what He says about me (Numbers 23:19; Jeremiah 29:11). I am the salt and light of the world, a city on a hill (Matthew 5:14). I will displace the darkness (John 1:5). I am God's coworker (1 Corinthians 3:9). I carry the keys to the kingdom (Matthew 16:19). I am a kingdom mover; forcefully advancing God's rule, reign, and love (Matthew 11:12; Matthew 28:18-20). I throw off all hurts, offenses, and choose to lay them at the feet of Christ (1 Peter 5:7). It is my joy to overlook offenses (Proverbs 19:11). I put on the garments of praise and the oil of gladness (Isaiah 61:3).

I am a minister of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5:18). I am commissioned to make disciples (Matthew 28:19-20). I am empowered by the Holy Spirit dwelling within me (Romans 8:11). I choose to partner with God to bring His kingdom and love on earth as it is in Heaven (Matthew 6:10). I have eternal significance (1 John 2:17). I have been seen since before the creation of the world (Psalm 139:16). God cares so much for me He has even numbered the hairs on my head (Matthew 10:30). God's thoughts about me outnumber the sand on the seashore (Psalm 139:17-18). I am deeply loved by my Father in Heaven (1 John 3:1). My Father hears me and speaks to me (1 John 5:14-15; John 10:27). He has promised to always be with me (Matthew 28:20). My body is a temple of the Lord and He lives in me (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

I am united with Jesus (John 17:21). I have been crucified with Christ (Galatians 2:20). I died with Him (Romans 6:8). I was buried with Him (Romans 6:4). Neither death nor sin has a hold on me (Romans 6:9). My sins have been thrown as far as the East is from the West (Psalm 103:12). I have been raised with Christ (Colossians 3:1). I am seated with Him in the heavenlies, far above all rule, all power, all authority, and above every name that is named, not only in this age, but also in the one to come (Ephesians 2:6; Colossians 3:1). Therefore, I carry the full authority of Christ (Matthew 28:18). I have authority over all sickness, over all disease, over death, over sin, over the flesh, over demons, and over the world (Luke 9:1-2). The enemy is not permitted to touch me (1 John 5:18).

I have the full armor of God (Ephesians 6:13-17). I put on the helmet of salvation, the breastplate of righteousness, the belt of truth, the boots of the gospel of peace. I take up the shield of faith and the sword of the Spirit (Ephesians 6:13-17). For my weapons of warfare are not fleshly. They are divinely powerful to tear down the strongholds of darkness (2 Corinthians 10:4). I put on the armor of light (Romans 13:12). I have been appointed to bear much and lasting fruit (John 15:16). This fruit comes from abiding in Jesus, not my own doing (John 15:4-5). In my weakness, Christ is made strong (2 Corinthians 12:9). I can do all things through Christ who loves me (Philippians 4:13). Greater is He who is in me, than he who is in the world (1 John 4:4). In a world that is perishing, I am to God the pleasing aroma of Christ (2 Corinthians 2:15).

I renounce the lie that I am worthless, inadequate, helpless, or hopeless (Ephesians 2:10; 2 Corinthians 3:5; Isaiah 41:10; Romans 15:13). In Christ, I am significant (1 Peter 2:9). In Christ, I am blessed with every spiritual blessing (Ephesians 1:3). I am blessed so I can bless (Genesis 12:2). I have been given the ability to produce wealth so that the glory of God may be displayed in my life (Deuteronomy 8:18). I am made healthy because the curse of death has been defeated (1 Peter 2:24; Isaiah 53:5). I have a growing hunger for God (Matthew 5:6). I choose to receive the full resources of Heaven and all God has for me (Philippians 4:19; James 1:17). I am planted in His goodness (Psalm 1:3). I fear no bad report for my trust is in God, my creator and sustainer (Psalm 112:7; Psalm 139:13-14; Colossians 1:17).

My pain and past have not been wasted (Romans 8:28). I am established in His unshakable Kingdom (Hebrews 12:28). I will not be moved unless it is to continue to walk in faith, compelled by God's love (Psalm 16:8; Galatians 2:20; 2 Corinthians 5:14). I live by faith, not by sight (2 Corinthians 5:7). I have entered into His glory (John 17:22). I can rest in the presence of the Almighty because He is my Father, my protector, and my friend (Psalm 91:1; Matthew 6:9; Psalm 121:7-8; John 15:15). He is my shield and my strong tower (Psalm 28:7; Proverbs 18:10). He is my refuge in times of need (Psalm 46:1). I am sheltered in Him (Psalm 91:4). God is with me and that is enough (Isaiah 41:10; 2 Corinthians 12:9).
